PRIVACY POLICY

What is the purpose of this notice?

To describe how we collect and use personal data about you in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

What we need

Native Irish Draught Horse CLG. 46 St Mary's Road, Midleton, Co. Cork. Company number 588974. ("IDHBA", "we", "our" and "us") is committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. For the purpose of the General Data Protection Regulations 2018.

We only collect basic personal data about you which does not include any special categories of personal information about you (known as Special Category Data). This does however include name, address, e-mail, telephone number & date of birth where applicable.

Why we need it

We need to know your basic personal data to process memberships & keep members informed of news & events within the Association. We will not collect any personal data from you we do not need to, to provide and oversee this service to you.

What we do with it

We only ever use your personal data with your consent, or where it is necessary:

- to comply with a legal duty
- to protect your vital interests
- for our own lawful interests, provided your rights don't override these.

In any event, we will only use your information for the purpose or purposes it was collected for (or for closely related purposes).

We may process personal information for certain legitimate business purposes, which include some or all of the following:

- where the processing enables us to enhance, modify, personalise or otherwise improve our services/communications for the benefit of our members.
- to enhance the security of our network and information systems

Whenever we process data for these purposes we will ensure that we always keep your personal data rights in high regard and take account of these rights at all times.

You have the right to object to this processing if you wish, and if you wish to do so please contact us. Please bear in mind that if you object this may affect our ability to carry out the tasks above for your benefit.

Disclosure of your information

Subject to our legal obligations of confidentiality set out above, we do share your information as follows:

With the branch you as a member has joined.

Where you have otherwise consented to disclosure.

Where we keep it

At the office of the secretariat, and also with branch secretaries.

How long we keep it

We continually review what information we hold and delete what is no longer required. We will not retain your data for any longer than necessary.

What are your rights?

We want to ensure that you remain in control of your personal data. Part of this is making sure you understand your legal rights, which are as follows:

- the right to confirmation as to whether we have your personal data and, if we do, to obtain a copy of the personal information we hold (this is known as a data subject access request)
- the right to have your data erased (though this will not apply where it is necessary for us to continue to use the data for a lawful reason)
- the right to have inaccurate data rectified; and
- the right to object to your data being used for marketing or profiling

Please keep in mind that there are exceptions to the rights above and, though we will always try to respond to your satisfaction, there may be situations where we are unable to do so.

If you wish to raise a complaint on how we have handled your personal data, you can contact our Data Privacy Officer who will investigate the matter.

If you are not satisfied with our response or believe we are processing your personal data not in accordance with the law you can complain to the Data Protection Commissioner.
